*Much writing on citizenship focuses on legal-political aspects seldom examining how this category shapes difference and is located in everyday processes of people’s lives. This course examines the concept and social construction of citizen at the intersections of race, gender and migration. The course focuses on how these social processes shape Latina/o identity so that we can better understand the inclusion and exclusion of Latino immigrants in the U.S. and the consequential impact on social, economic, political and cultural life. This is an upper-division lecture course.*
