AES UNDERGRADUATE MAJOR REQUIREMENTS

AES requires sixty (60) credits to fulfill the AES Major Requirements.

Thirty-five (35) credits will come from the three Core courses area:

AES Core Courses: fifteen credits must come from: [15]

- AES 150 Introductory History of American Ethnic Groups (5) I&S
- AES 151 Introduction to the Cultures of American Ethnic Groups (5) I&S
- AES 212 Comparative American Ethnic Literature (5) I&S/VLPA

The AES Department offers these major Core courses on a yearly basis.

Area Core Courses: fifteen credits must come from: [15]

- AAS 101 Introduction to Asian American Cultures (5) I&S
- AFRAM 101 Introduction to African American Studies (5) I&S
- CHSTU 101 Introduction to Chicano Studies (5) I&S

Capstone Course: Five credits from ONE of the following: [5]

- AES 495 Senior Seminar (5) I&S
- OR**
- AES 496 Senior Thesis (5-10) I&S

- *The above courses **do not** count toward the concentration area.*
