Faculty Meeting Minutes (Non-executive session) April 5, 2016

Proceedings:

- Meeting called to order by chair at 12:05pm.
- Minutes approved from prior meeting.
- Bernard mentioned that at a recent meeting for department chairs, CAS web
 designers gave a presentation on the services they provide. The division of
 Natural Sciences is up next for departmental website redesign. It also pulls
 content from the time schedule to show current course offerings. Other
 departments expressed positive feedback regarding their experiences in the
 redesign process. Bernard announced that the computing committee agree we
 join the effort. Timing would mean beta mode winter 2017 and publishing
 spring 2017. (It is not possible to have the redesign earlier.)
 - Randy noted that feedback is welcome as well as any updated images one might have for the current departmental website.
 - A web committee will have to be created to interact with the CAS team.
 This committee should have people on it who will also be trained on how to update the content on the site.
- Bernard discussed some details related to Tim Leung's acceptance of the departmental offer. Tim will take over as director of the CFRM program, effective immediately on arrival, as Doug had already planned to step down on June 30. Doug and Matt expressed Tim's suitability for the role and noted his presence will be great for the future of the CFRM program.
- Bernard noted that a former AA PhD/AMATH MS graduate, Paul Reeves, and his
 wife Sharon, have committed to an estate gift. The Reeves have specified that
 the gift is awarded to AA but it should be used in ways that enhance joint efforts
 and collaboration between AA and AMATH.
- The Executive Committee and Bernard have discussed appointing a teaching mentor starting next academic year. The idea is that the mentor will guide new faculty, postdocs, and any graduate students who are new to teaching in the department. Mark Kot has agreed to serve in this role.
