Olson Fellowship Application

Background: The annual Olson Fellowship at the University of Washington originates through the generosity of the late Ronald Leroy Olson, who reserved a portion of his estate to provide financial support for "worthy University of Washington graduate students in the field of anthropology." Whenever possible, these students are to be "members of a Native American or Native Alaskan Tribe" and ideally "from Washington (state), British Columbia, or Alaska...(whether) Indian or Eskimo." However, it is quite clear that Professor Olson did not wish to exclude worthy students from other regions, or of different ethnic backgrounds.

Provisions: The Olson Fellowship is a one-year award that usually provides: resident tuition for three academic quarters, and a concurrent small quarterly stipend. (Funding subject to change without notice.)

Fellowship Criteria: Upon determination by the Olson Fellowship Review Committee that the candidate meets all normal qualifications for admission to an advanced degree program in the Department, the Committee shall be guided in its selection process by the following criteria:

1. **First priority is given to applicants for initial admission into the Department** who are members of Native American or Native Alaskan Tribes recognized by the United States or Canadian governments with the added preference for applicants born in Washington, Alaska, or British Columbia.
2. **Second priority shall be given to applicants currently enrolled as graduate students** in the Department and making satisfactory progress who meet the tribal membership criteria established in #1, above.
3. **Third priority shall be given to applicants for initial admission into the Department** who are not members of Native American or Native Alaskan Tribes but who intend to specialize in linguistic, ethnological, archaeological, or biological studies of Native American peoples, particularly those of the Pacific Northwest.
4. **Fourth priority shall be given to students currently enrolled as graduate students in the Department** and making satisfactory progress who otherwise meet the criteria given in #3, above.
5. **Past or present Olson Fellows** will be considered under the criteria listed in #2 and #3 above, but will rank below other candidates within those categories. In all decisions among candidates of equal priority, the principal criterion shall be overall academic promise as judged by the Olson Fellowship Review Committee.
