### Exempt Lobby Update

The House Ways and Means Committee's last draft of the biennial budget separates the counselors and librarians at Washington state colleges from the rest of the exempt staff group and ties them to the faculty for salary increases. The language of this last draft is not what we asked for, and we are still trying to find out how it developed.

Our lobbying efforts continue to support the linking of all exempt with faculty. Our lobbyists are still contracted to us, and until the end of the session will be campaigning for all exempt staff. Sharon Foster (ph. 1-943-6929) and Dick Barrett (ph. 1-754-2311) need our input in order to do their jobs. It is also important that counselors and librarians keep the pressure on to keep their positions linked with faculty, particularly with the Senate Ways and Means Committee.

The separation of exempt staff from the faculty is a dangerous precedent: legislators will find it easier to retain the separation in the future, making any future efforts to bring the two groups together for salary increases all the more difficult. The success of the counselors and librarians can be credited directly to their own organized and visible presence in Olympia. You can still make a difference if you act now!

Applicants whose applications were complete by the March 1 priority date will be admitted with AI's of 57 or higher for residents, 80 or higher for nonresidents.
