Note 1: This chart illustrates requirements for students entering with no prior architectural education. Courses listed in the prerequisite year are not included in the calculation of the grade-point average. In addition to the prerequisite year, or equivalent pre-professional architectural degree, 91 credits are required for completion of the MArch (30 studio; 19 core; 12 selective; 18 elective; 12 thesis prep and thesis).

Note 2: Students entering the M Arch Program with a pre-professional degree (BA or BS with a major in architecture) typically start with Year 1, depending on academic and professional experience.

Note 3: Courses in Italics are offered in other quarters in addition to the one shown. Graduate Seminar Selectives are ARCH seminars involving student presentation of ideas in discussion and writing. Electives may be any course, 400 level or above within the Department or with advisor's approval, 300 level or above outside of Architecture within the University.

Note 4: For students in the accredited M Arch program, the independent thesis option requires faculty acceptance of the student's proposed thesis study in ARCH 599.
