The University of Washington has one of the oldest and most extensive China Studies programs in the US, and is unique among American universities in hosting this program through a collaboration of China Studies and the College of Built Environments (formerly Architecture and Urban Planning, the Pacific Northwest's premier urban school of planning, design and construction and a partner of several Universities in China, including Beijing University, Tsinghua University, Sichuan University, and Chongqing College of Architecture and Urban Planning, China).
