**Dr. Sulmasy** is the Kilbride-Clinton Professor of Medicine and Ethics in the Department of Medicine and Divinity School at the University of Chicago, where he serves as Associate Director of the MacLean Center for Clinical Medical Ethics. His research interests encompass both theoretical and empirical investigations of the ethics of end-of-life decision-making, ethics education, and spirituality in medicine.

He is the author of four books—*The Healer's Calling* (1997), *Methods in Medical Ethics* (2001; 2<sup>nd</sup> ed. 2010), *The Rebirth of the Clinic* (2006), and *A Balm for Gilead* (2006), and the editor-in-chief of the journal, *Theoretical Medicine and Bioethics*. He has served on numerous governmental advisory committees, and was appointed to the Presidential Commission for the Study of Bioethical Issues by President Obama in 2010.
