



## APPLICATION PROCESS

1. The Business School application will be on the web in **mid-November 2004** at:  
[depts.washington.edu/bschool/undergrad/pros\\_students.shtml](http://depts.washington.edu/bschool/undergrad/pros_students.shtml)
2. Register for The Writing Skills Assessment (WSA). A registration form and test dates are in the application packet. For the best choice in dates, return your application form by **mid-February**. The WSA is administered in **January, February, and March**.
3. Submit the Business School application by **April 5**, to include:
  - A personal statement. Information on topics to be covered is in the application.
  - Copies of unofficial transcripts from every college you have attended (except the UW) through **winter 2005**. If you have already declared Pre-Business status, those transcripts may already be in your Business School file. Check to make sure.

Note: Students are allowed to apply for one option when applying to the Business School. Options are not required.

### Admission Criteria

*All Applicants must have the following minimum GPA's:*

- 2.5 cumulative UW GPA
- 2.5 cumulative UW business GPA
- 2.5 cumulative GPA including transferable coursework
- 2.5 cumulative business GPA including transferable coursework

*Since eligible applicants exceed the space available, admission is competitive. Candidates are evaluated on:*

- Overall scholastic record (including significantly higher recent grades)
- Grades in courses that must be completed before the application deadline
- The Writing Skills Assessment (two essays written in a proctored setting)
- A personal statement that addresses:
  - Cultural awareness
  - Economic and educational disadvantage
  - Personal adversity
  - Evidence of leadership skills, community service, and the promise of achievement in a business or professional career.

### Pre-Business Major

UW Students may declare Pre-Business status once 45 credits have been completed and a minimum of a 2.85 GPA earned. Benefits include having a student file in the Undergraduate Program Office, access to Business School advisers, and access to the Business School student listserv. Pre-Business status does not give any advantage in the admission process.

### Freshman Admission Program (FRAP)

The Business School invites a small number of students each year directly out of high school, prior to completion of university-level prerequisites. Freshman applicants to the University who list Business as their intended major are automatically considered. Admission is offered to students with exceptionally competitive academic records, including, but not limited to, high school GPA and SAT or ACT scores. Admission is for autumn quarter and is by invitation only.
