**\* March 7 – Deadline to Comment on Draft Recommendations for Engaging Communities as Partners in Cancer Clinical Trials.** Communities as Partners in Cancer Clinical Trials: Changing Research, Practice and Policy is a joint initiative of the Education Network to Advance Cancer Clinical Trials and CCPH that is exploring the potential of employing community-based participatory research principles and approaches in Phase III cancer treatment trials. Three workgroups have developed draft recommendations and will be reconvening in mid-March to further refine them.
