* **Curriculum on Developing and Sustaining Community-Based Participatory Research Partnerships Now Available Online!** Developing and Sustaining Community-Based Participatory Research Partnerships: A Skill-Building Curriculum, is now available online at www.cbprcurriculum.info. The curriculum was developed by the Community-Institutional Partnerships for Prevention Research Group, a collaboration involving 9 organizations in the US and Canada, including CCPH. Curriculum development and pilot-testing was funded by the Prevention Research Center Program Office at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention through a cooperative agreement with the Association of Schools of Public Health. Generous funding from the Wellesley Institute enabled the curriculum to be made available online.
