*** Register Today for January 13th Educational Conference Call: Citizen Engagement at the Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR): From Governance to Community-Based Research.**

The 7th call in CCPH's 2009-2010 Educational Conference Call Series on Building Community Capacity for Research takes place on January 13th from 3:30-5 pm EST. During this call, participants will learn about CIHR's Citizen Engagement Framework and how it is being implemented at the macro level (e.g., through the agency's governance structure, strategic planning and peer review processes), the mid level (e.g., through Institute and branch initiatives) and the micro level (e.g., through funding programs and tools such as community-based research initiatives). Participants will be encouraged to consider ways they can contribute to public research funding agency priority-setting and research processes, as well as ways they can engage citizens more meaningfully in their work. A CBR housing study funded through CIHR entitled "Positive Spaces, Healthy Places: An Innovative Community-Academic-Policy Partnership" will also be showcased. The call is free of charge for those dialing in from the US and Canada.
