**\* How Can Colleges & Universities Contribute to Urban Revitalization?** Portland State University President Wim Wiewel will address this question and more in his plenary presentation, challenging us to consider the broader scope and impact of the "engaged campus" made possible through economic roles in communities. Prior to coming to PSU, Wiewel was the provost and senior vice president of Academic Affairs at the University of Baltimore. From 1979-2004, Wiewel was with the University of Illinois at Chicago (UIC), where he most served as dean of the College of Business Administration. Wiewel also directed UIC's Center for Urban Economic Development.

**\* Community-Based Participatory Film Documents Health Impact of the Built Environment in Post-Katrina New Orleans!** In the film, *In Harmony: Reflections, Thoughts, and Hopes of Central City, New Orleans*, Caricia Catalani and colleagues used videovoice methodology, a health advocacy, education, and research methodology through which people get behind video cameras to research issues of concern, communicate knowledge, and advocate for change. The film features the findings of a community assessment process that identified concerns about the health impacts of the built environment in post-Katrina New Orleans, including housing, education, and employment. The film is available through CES4Health.info, a new mechanism for peer-reviewed publication and dissemination of diverse products of community-engaged scholarship that come in forms other than journal articles.
