***June 3 Community Partner Conference Call.** This call is the first in a series that will respond to frequently asked questions about NIH funding we've been receiving from community-based organizations. Each call will include speakers who will provide answers and insights from their direct experience, helpful handouts and links to relevant resources. The first call is scheduled for June 3 from 12:30-2 pm pacific time / 3:30-5 pm eastern time and will address the "why and how" of obtaining a federally negotiated indirect rate, a federal wide assurance for human subjects research, and registration through grants.gov and NIH eraCommons.
