Joining us as a major partner is the Northwest Health Foundation in Portland, founded in 1997 to advance the health of the people of Oregon and southwest Washington. **\* CCPH and Centre for Community-Based Research Collaborate to Support CUexpo 2011!** Mark your calendars for "Community-University Partnerships: Bringing Global Perspectives to Local Action," May 11-15, 2011 in Waterloo Region, Ontario. The Community-University Exposition (CUexpo) is a Canadian-led community-university partnerships conference held every three years. An estimated 130 CCPH members attended CUexpo 2008 and found it synergistic with CCPH's mission, values and goals. Given that synergy and CCPH's growing membership in Canada, we have decided to fully support CUexpo in lieu of our own major conference in 2011. CCPH and the Centre for Community-Based Research (the hosting organization for CUexpo 2011) have signed a partnership agreement that specifies CCPH's role as a major partner in the conference.
