CES4Health Celebrates 2nd Anniversary! In just two years, <http://CES4Health.info> has established itself as a valued resource for peer-reviewed publication and dissemination of diverse products of community-engaged scholarship. Thirty-two products have been published through the site, including videos, policy reports, training curricula, digital stories and a cookbook! The latest resource to be published is **Awakening Choices: Colon Health, Our Stories**, a 28-minute movie available on DVD that shares the stories of Alaska Native men and women talking about recommended colorectal cancer screening exams and wellness ways to decrease cancer risk. The DVD also includes a 5-minute preview of the movie and a 30-second public service announcement designed for television use. A booklet and a 24-page activity guide with four interactive activities accompany the movie to support continued learning and community cancer education. CES4Health Appoints Two New Associate Editors! Joining the editorial team of CES4Health are new associate editors Kim Radda and Fay Fletcher. Kim is an anthropologist and registered nurse. She has conducted extensive community-based research on substance abuse, HIV risk, and the health and mental health of older adults, as well as research on rural women's social and economic roles in Mexico. She is currently the Director of Research Administration at the Institute for Community Research in Hartford, CT. Fay is an Associate Professor within the Extension Department at the University of Alberta in Edmonton, Alberta Canada. There she serves as co-director of the Community Health Research Network a team engaged in research partnerships that explore the social determinants of health for the purpose of improving health outcomes with minority and marginalized populations. CCPH Paper Examines Key Influences on Long-Term Sustainability of Service-Learning in Higher Education. The latest issue of NSEE Perspectives, published by the National Society of Experiential Education, features results from the 10-year follow-up study of the Health Professions Schools in Service to the Nation (HPSISN) Program led by CCPH senior consultant Amanda Vogel. HPSISN was the first and still the only national demonstration program of service-learning in health professions education. The paper summarizes the methods and findings from the study, and provides links to webpages where you can read more detailed descriptions, access their interview guide, and read about related prior research.
