## CDC PREVENTION RESEARCH CENTER PROGRAM SEEKS TO UNDERSTAND TRUST AMONG PARTNERS INVOLVED IN COMMUNITY-BASED PARTICIPATORY RESEARCH

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention’s (CDC) Prevention Research Center (PRC) program Office is supporting a new project, Community-Institutional Partnerships: Understanding Trust Among Partners.

In the PRC conceptual framework, trust is a motivating condition for developing and maintaining partner relationships. In addition, the Association of Schools of Public Health (ASPH)/CDC project that CCPH is coordinating, “Examining Community-Institutional Partnerships for Prevention Research”, identified trust as the cornerstone of community-institutional relationships. Partner relations are crucial to the success of the Prevention Research Centers’ activities and affect the communities in which research occurs. This project is designed to learn about partners’ experiences with and opinions about trust in their relationships. By conducting focus groups with PRC community, academic, and state representatives, we hope to 1) gain understanding of the attributes and behaviors associated with establishing and maintaining trusting partnerships, 2) characterize partners’ perceptions of their relationships and determine whether these perceptions stem from individual-level, organizational-level, or both types of relationships, and 3) identify attitudes and behaviors before and after partnerships are developed to determine whether a continuum of trust exists. This information, combined with results from a literature review of trust, will be used to determine the feasibility of refining and validating a tool for measuring and monitoring partners’ degree of trust.

The project is being conducted with assistance from ORC Macro and will be guided by a team of PRC partners (including community, state, and academic representatives). ## IOM REPORT: PATIENT SAFETY NEEDS INFO UPGRADE

The nation’s health care system needs an immediate information technology upgrade that would give clinicians access to their patients’ past medical histories, provide them with decision-making tools based on the latest research and routinely capture patient safety information, according to an Institute of Medicine (IOM) report published in December. American health care is facing the same kinds of safety and error concerns that confronted the airline industry years ago. But “pilots have immediate access to the information they need to make informed decisions. In health care today, no such information technology infrastructure exists,” the report authors write.

Widespread use of patient electronic health records, secure exchange technologies to transfer sensitive health information and patient safety data standards are necessary to stop the tens of thousands of errors that the report authors say have crept into the U.S. health care system. The federal government should provide financial support for all of these information upgrades, the report concludes. The report also suggests that Congress provide direction and financial support for national patient safety data standards that would be administered through the Department of Health and Human Services, the Agency for Healthcare Reform and Quality and the National Library of Medicine. The report authors believe these changes will take at least a decade to implement.
