IARSLCE: What Is It?

- International Association for Research on Service-learning and Community Engagement
- Hosts annual international research conference
- Publishes peer reviewed volume of best papers from conferences
- Facilitates exchange among researchers
- Supports graduate students and junior faculty
- Recognition through three annual awards



IARSLCE: Current Work

- Community-university partnerships is one topic addressed in conference presentations
- Some awards and scholarships recognize work in this area (dissertation, early career awards)
- Research spans educational continuum, geography, disciplines
- New efforts on engaged scholarship and partnerships (former National Review Board)
- Opportunity for greater emphasis



IARSLCE: Opportunities

- Convene research forum on community-university partnerships in conjunction with October 9-12, 2009 conference in Ottawa
- Focus a plenary session on this agenda
- Facilitate information exchange on current and proposed research through membership
- Showcase this research as program theme
- Create parallel meetings to advance discussion



IARSLCE: Two Focus Areas

- Graduate Student Network
 - Virtual and in-person venue to identify and convene beginning researchers interested in partnerships
 - Build network of students and faculty mentors with interests in partnership research
- Review Board on Engaged Scholarship
 - Venue to give expert peer review on scholarship
 - Identify community partnerships expertise
 - Collaboration with parallel efforts of CCPH, Campus Compact, Imagining America

- Network of universities, colleges and community-based organizations interested in the practice of community service-learning
- Offers consultations, resources, education, networking, advocacy

- Research Working Group
- On-line forum for CSL researchers
- Research highlights in e-newsletter
- Launching national awards for SOCIAL IMPACT related to community/campus partnerships



CACSL

- Emerging individual research agendas
- CACSL advocating for attention to the relationships as of primary importance
- National Forum on Community-University Partnerships, September 2007: reports available
- CSL Symposium with CUP as one focus, March 2008: report in next e-newsletter
- Case study project to be led by CACSL, examining establishment of partnerships



CACSL

- Case studies on Canadian partnerships will identify further specific themes for research
- CACSL views the support of applied research as its priority for future: funding, education, networking, advocacy
- Develop pool of research projects for post-grad students to undertake; utilize the CSL model to advance network knowledge and resources
- Capitalize on Canadian location for 2009 IARSLCE conference to FOCUS on the critical relationship element



CCPH: What is It?

- Community-Campus Partnerships for Health
- Promotes health (broadly defined) through community-campus partnerships
- Diverse membership: community, academic, government, philanthropic



CCPH: Current Work

- Build cadre of community-engaged faculty
- Recognize exemplary partnerships
- Facilitate opportunities to present & publish
- Disseminate timely information
- Sponsor/conduct research & evaluation
- Advocate for supportive policies & funding
- Ensure community voice is heard
- Ensure findings have practical application



CCPH: Two Focus Areas

- Faculty for the Engaged Campus
 - Competency based faculty development models
 - Peer review, publication & dissemination of non-traditional products of scholarship (www.CES4health.info)
 - Roster of peer reviewers and mentors (community & academic)
- Community-Based Participatory Research
 - CBPR listserv & website
 - CBPR & research ethics listserv & website
 - IRB/REB work group
 - Community partner peer support & advocacy
 - Training, consultation, educational conference calls



CCPH: Opportunities

- CBPR listserv: cbpr@u.washington.edu
- Educational conference call series on CBPR: May 27, June 13 and June 24
- Build capacity through faculty development, CES4health.info & roster of peer reviewers
- Proposal in development: community research agendas in US cities (Canada too?)
- Nominate community-university partnerships as topic of evidence-based review
- 11th conference, April 29 – May 2, 2009 in Milwaukee, Wisconsin USA



Creating a Research Agenda

- Generate ideas for research topics
- Exchange information on potential funding opportunities
- Network to establish new collaborations
- Seed agendas for each of the three associations



Generate Ideas for Research Topics

- Convene in groups of 4-6
- Introduce yourselves
- Brainstorm research topics
 - Be specific on focus
 - Address possible collaborators
- Identify funding sources
- Consider how associations can help
