Hall Health Travel Clinic offers pre-travel counseling, immunizations, and health advice for adults and children who are planning to travel out of the U.S. or Canada. The clinic is a Washington State Department of Health-designated center for yellow fever vaccine.

Pre-travel consultations are available by appointment. Travelers will be asked to complete a questionnaire regarding travel plans. It is important to bring all immunization records available.

Because several weeks may be required to complete a needed vaccine series, we recommend the initial appointment be held at least 4 weeks before departure. You should telephone for an appointment two weeks before that, if possible. When this is not possible, we will meet your travel health needs as completely as the time we have allows.

The consultation includes:

- Country-by-country analysis of your itinerary, anticipated activities, and review of previous immunizations to develop an individualized plan.
- Advice on malaria prophylaxis and options for anti-malaria medications. Prescriptions can be e-sent to desired pharmacies and are filled at the traveler's expense. Rubenstein Pharmacy at Hall Health is also available for travel related prescriptions
- Information and prescriptions for medications to help prevent or treat illnesses while traveling.
- International Certificate of Vaccination as approved by the World Health Organization.
- Hall Health Immunization Clinic administration of your planned vaccines on the day of your consultation or as scheduled.

What do I do if I am ill or injured when I return?

In spite of the best planning and preventive measures, accidents and illnesses can happen when traveling. Hall Health Center offers comprehensive medical care to the returned traveler who is not feeling well. We will see students after travel

at any time. We also see recently ill or injured non-students living in Washington State who have traveled within the preceding 3 months. Call for an appointment (206-616-2495) upon your return if you develop a fever or other illness, especially if you may have been exposed to malaria.

For travel problems related to travel that occurred more than 3 months ago, are extensively complex or for persons desiring a second opinion or for persons out of state we suggest consultation with the Infectious Disease Specialty Clinic at UWMC: 206-598-4615 or HMC: 206-731-5100. This consultation requires a physician referral and a medical record review prior to scheduling an appointment.
