COURSE DESCRIPTION

This conference is an in-depth, cross-disciplinary review of breast cancer tumor topics in medicine. Leading experts in the fields will present the latest updates and clinical recommendations in breast cancer diagnosis, treatment and care. The diagnosis and treatment of breast cancer patients is a constantly evolving area of medicine. Clinicians who treat breast cancer patients are increasingly part of a multi-disciplinary team and need to understand new options in the clinical management of their patients. Discussion will be based on some of the most late-breaking and controversial areas of breast cancer management.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

- *Discuss NCI State-of-the-Science recommendations on DCIS*

- *Explore issues around bone loss and new agents targeting bone*
- *Discuss surgical and radiation perspectives on treatment*
- *Describe rare breast tumor presentations, including male breast cancer, breast implants, and Paget's disease*
- *Apply practical experience in clinical situation through case presentations*
