WHO SHOULD ATTEND

This is a conference for health care providers who provide medical care to the general population, including healthy adults and those individuals identified as high-risk: pregnant women, children, the elderly and those with special healthcare needs.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This one-day conference is a cooperative venture of the American Medical Association, the Infectious Diseases Society of America and the University of Washington. It focuses on public health infectious disease emergencies and the role of the practicing clinician. The morning session is a tailored version of the AMA's "Basic Disaster Life Support™ (BDLS®)" and "Advanced Disaster Life Support™ (ADLS®)" courses. It will introduce the components of the DISASTER Paradigm™ and triage models, as applied to "all hazards" preparedness, and specifically, to biological events. Afternoon sessions will feature nationally recognized experts in infectious disease with "hot off the press" information on biological events that demand early recognition and emergency response, such as anthrax and emerging infectious diseases, including influenza A H1N1 (swine flu).

ACCREDITATION

The University of Washington School of Medicine is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education to provide continuing medical education for physicians.
