Washington State healthcare providers - physicians, dentists, podiatrists, osteopathic physicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants

## COURSE DESCRIPTION

On March 25, 2010, Governor Gregoire signed into law, Washington State Bill 2876, requiring healthcare boards/commissions who oversee Washington prescribers to develop and adopt rules regarding pain management by June 30, 2011. These rules pertain to physicians, physician assistants, osteopathic physicians, dentists, podiatrists and nurse practitioners. The rules address assessment, therapy and monitoring of patients with chronic non-cancer pain and particularly emphasize when a primary caregiver should seek consultation from a pain specialist and the definition of such a specialist. Inasmuch as pain is the most common presenting symptom for patients seeking medical care, it is not surprising that both the law and the subsequent rules have elicited widespread interest and controversy. This conference will present the "whys, whats and wherefores" of Bill 2876 in a series of lectures and case-based panel discussions (including Q & A) of appropriate patient evaluation and treatment of the patient in pain.

## COURSE OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this activity, attendees should be able to:

- Discuss what prompted the Washington State Legislature to pass Bill 2876
- Describe the basic rules required for opiate treatment of chronic pain
- Describe how the new rules define a pain specialist and recognize when a specialist should be consulted
- Recognize the importance of evaluating both pain AND function in any pain treatment plan
- Utilize several assessment and monitoring tools which can quickly and easily help guide pain therapy
