## **MAJOR DUTIES:**

Identifies and selects journal articles and other references for addition to the Fire Effects Library. Assigns keywords to references based on species, plant communities, fire history, fire effects, and other ecological subject matter. Enters exact, detailed citation information into CRS for retrieval by scientists and managers. Files library materials. Assists in maintaining library and helps users locate references.

Proofreads and corrects all bibliographies in preparation for publication in the Fire Effects Information System. Checks for completeness, accuracy, and conformity to style requirements.

Locates scientific and technical information on fire ecology, fire effects, fire regimes, plant communities, succession, regeneration, and taxonomy. Identifies patterns and knowledge gaps. Produces technical publications on fire ecology, fire effects, and fire regimes following FEIS templates. Ensures that documents submitted for editing contain the proper elements in the proper order, on the proper material, in the correct FEIS format. Collaborates with FEIS editors to improve and complete publications.

Maintains educational materials in the FireWorks trunk; assists with planning and conducting training sessions in FEIS and the FireWorks educational program. Teaches students and other visitors about the science of wildland fire; helps provide tours for students and other visitors.
