Assistant Professor in Forest Economics - 1.0 FTE 9-month tenure-track appointment in the Department of Forest Engineering, Resources & Management. Key responsibilities include delivering quality instruction in the Department's professional forestry degree programs and conducting research on the application of economic analysis to problems of active management of the forest resource for an array of objectives. Subject areas may include, but are not limited to, economic analysis of various forest management and silvicultural applications; markets, marketing, and trade in wood products; non-timber forest products and ecosystem services; and management of (and for) fire and other natural processes.
