## Public Affairs Specialist GS-1035-9/11

The Pacific Northwest (PNW) Research Station is seeking an exceptional employee for a permanent position as a GS-1035-9/11 Public Affairs Specialist. The incumbent will manage internal communications and assist with external communications for the station. This position works in the station's Communications and Applications Unit with direct responsibility to the Assistant Station Director's Office in Director for Communications and Applications. The position is located at the Station Director's Office in Portland, Oregon.

The incumbent:

- Manages the station's internal communications by identifying key needs for improving communications on an ongoing basis, planning a program of work, serving as managing editor and writer for the station's internal newsletter, facilitating internal station meetings, and maintaining connections to station retirees.
- Coordinates internal communication efforts with other Forest Service research stations, the agency's Pacific Northwest and Alaska Regions, and the Washington Office (WO) by responding to requests for information, coordinating visits by WO leadership, and preparing joint products for communicating with employees.
- Organizes digital station assets, including photos and video.
- Helps the Assistant Station Director preserve and document station history.
- Researches, writes, and prepares news releases, newsletters, Web content, and other written materials that deliver science information to station stakeholders, including news media and the general public.
- Assists with the hosting of special events and electronic forums designed to foster public understanding of scientific information generated by station researchers.
- Serves as the station's media relations backup and coordinates interviews and other communications among station scientists, the WO, and news media.

The purpose of this outreach notice is to determine the potential applicant pool for this position. Responses received from this outreach notice will be relied upon to make this determination.

#### About the Pacific Northwest Research Station and the Station Director's Office:

The PNW Research Station is one of seven research units in the USDA Forest Service. The Forest Service conducts the most extensive and productive program of integrated forestry research in the world. The scientific information produced by the station has application on public, private, and tribal lands in





the Pacific Northwest (Alaska, Oregon, and Washington) and elsewhere in the United States and other parts of the world. The station's programs reflect the changing character of the questions that science is being asked to help answer.

PNW Research Station has approximately 300 permanent and temporary employees in professional, administrative, research, technical, and clerical positions. There are five program managers who oversee program organizations, and 11 laboratories that provide research in Oregon, Washington, and Alaska. The station is also involved in international relations with foreign governmental agencies and universities in many areas of research. The work activities of the station attract considerable interest from Congress, special interest groups, and the public. The Station Director's Office is located in downtown Portland. Public transportation is available and further information is available upon request.

#### **Community Information:**

The City of Portland is located in the northwest part of the state of Oregon, bordering Vancouver, Washington. The major highways intersecting the city are I-5, I-84, I-205, and US-26.
