Natural Resource Worker 2 (Non-Permanent, Full-time)

The Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife is recruiting to fill one full time, non-permanent, Natural Resource Worker 2 position located in the Wildlife Program, Region 3. The duty station is 2030 Holady Road, Mabton, WA, Yakima County. The anticipated employment period is scheduled for April 1 to September 30, 2015.

*Interviews are scheduled for April 1, 2015.

The Natural Resource Worker 2 position, under direction from the Natural Resource Specialist 2 assigned to the Sunnyside/Snake River Wildlife Area Complex will carry out the duties of noxious weed control activities, as well as habitat improvement/maintenance projects.

DUTIES:

• Habitat maintenance and improvement

Tasks include:

Apply herbicides to control noxious weeds, use mechanical equipment such as tractor-pulled mowers, ATV mounted sprayers, backpack sprayers, truck mounted sprayers, and gas-powered hand tools to control vegetation. Assist with habitat manipulation by planting annual and perennial crops for the benefit of wildlife using a wide variety for agricultural equipment including wheel tractors, track-type tractors, plows, discs, cultivators, rod-weeders, harrows, ATVs, etc.

Equipment and Vehicle Operation and Maintenance

Tasks include:

Maintains and repairs wildlife area equipment including: Wheel tractors, track-type tractors, large trucks, equipment trailers, ATVs, dump trucks, large trucks, 4X4 pickups, shop equipment, gas-powered hand tools, and regular shop tools.

Reporting, Training, Office Work, and Other

Tasks include:

Fill out and maintain notes on weekly work activities. Attend required training activities to maintain Washington Public Operator Pesticide License. Keep current on safety training activities identified in the agency safety training matrix. Other duties as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS:

High school graduation or GED and three months of natural resource related labor experience.

<u>OR</u>

One year as a Natural Resource Worker 1.

College coursework involving major study in biology, zoology, fisheries, wildlife, chemistry, natural sciences, or a closely allied field will substitute, year for year, for experience, provided the coursework includes at least 6 semester or 9 quarter hours of natural science classes.

A valid Washington State or other State Driver's License.

PREFERRED:

Incumbents will be required to obtain one or more specialized skill qualifications or licenses, including but not limited to:

First aid training certification

Public Pesticide Applicators License

ATV safety training certification
