

EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES FACULTY OF FORESTRY AND ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT UNIVERSITY OF NEW BRUNSWICK

The Faculty of Forestry and Environmental Management at the University of New Brunswick in Fredericton, New Brunswick, Canada invites applications for a full-time probationary (tenure-track) appointment at the rank of Assistant Professor in Environmental Management, commencing July 1, 2015 or as negotiated.

Candidates must have a Ph.D., postdoctoral or equivalent experience, and a strong background in a variety of environmental management tools such as environmental impact assessment, environmental management systems (e.g., ISO14001), environmental risk assessment, lifecycle assessment, and environmental reporting. The candidate must have practical experience working with one or more of these tools. Demonstrated or potential for excellence in teaching at the undergraduate and graduate levels is also required. The successful candidate will be expected to teach classes in the Faculty's undergraduate and graduate environmental programs, conduct externally funded research, supervise graduate students, and publish their research in peer-reviewed academic journals.

Applicants should send a curriculum vitae, a brief (1-2 page) research program plan, and a short (1-page maximum) statement of teaching philosophy along with the names, addresses, e-mails, telephone and fax numbers of three (3) references. The application package should be submitted as a single PDF file by email to the Dean of the Faculty, Dr. Van Lantz (vlantz@unb.ca). Applicants should also arrange for three (3) letters of reference to be sent by email directly to the Dean (<u>vlantz@unb.ca</u>). Review of the applications will begin May 1st, 2015 and continue until the position is filled.

The University of New Brunswick is located in Fredericton, a small city (population = 56,000) in eastern Canada. The city has one of the largest amount of forest cover of any city in Canada, and offers great recreational opportunities and a vibrant social/cultural scene. The University is the oldest English speaking university in Canada, with two main campuses in Fredericton and Saint John and more than 8,000 undergraduate and 2,000 graduate students. The Faculty is more than 100 years old, offers seven degree programs in forestry and environmental management disciplines, has approximately 170 undergraduate and 90 graduate students, and 20 full-time faculty members (see www.unb.ca/fredericton/forestry for more information).

All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority. Applicants should indicate current citizenship status. This position is subject to budgetary approval.
