Anchorage - DENTEX - DHAT 1st year Student activities included:

The fourth cohort of DHAT Students started their first week of training with a five day Presession course in which they reviewed: program expectations, medical math, and Anatomy & Physiology.

Regular Classes began January 18th with:

- Infection control
- Introduction to Dental Health Aide
- o General Health Sciences

They also participated in the Project Homeless Connect in downtown Anchorage at the Egan Center with the Anchorage Neighborhood Health Clinic Dental Staff. The students interacted with participants by providing free oral health screenings. They also distributed toothbrushes, tooth paste and floss.
