## **DENTEX Training Clinic- First Year Activities**

The month of July has been relatively quiet at the training center while staff took some vacation and caught up on administrative activities such as the organization of curriculum. Rachel Schierholt, Senior Office Specialist for DENTEX, has been brushing up on her Dental Assistant skills in order to be able to support the more clinical aspects of the program as needed.

The main event of the month was the July 9<sup>th</sup> arrival of our Kellogg grant administrator Dr. Albert Yee. His visit coincided with the arrival of the RTI International evaluation team's visit to meet with representatives from Alaska Native Tribal Health Organizations which employ the 10 currently practicing Dental Health Aide Therapists. In addition, three students were available to meet with Dr. Yee during his visit; they are Benjamin Steward from Seward, Ooyuan Nagaruk from Elim and Danielle Boston from Chistochina. Dr. Yee spent time asking questions and getting a good feel for how they were doing and their plans for the future.

Mid July found the U.W. DENTEX training center turned into a film studio on two separate occasions. First, we hosted the Stone Soup Group "film crew" of Cheri Scott and Becky Branson. They are making a video for families of kids with special needs which will introduce the different sights and sounds of a dental office prior to the first visit. The idea is that the kids can watch the video before going to the office allowing them to get an understanding of the often stress producing noises and instruments before they encounter them, thus preparing them for a successful and low stress appointment.

The second film crew came from the Kellogg Foundation. They are making a video for their website which will highlight the work being done at DENTEX and by DHATs across the state. The crew traveled to Sitka, Angoon, Kotzebue and Kiana. They interviewed program staff and students.

The students returned to class in late July and our Summer Quarter started out with a visit by Ruth Ballweg, Director of the UW MEDEX Northwest Physician Assistant Training Program. She has been an ardent supporter of our program and enjoys interacting with the students. Dr. Tony Brusca began his class on pediatric Stainless Steel Crown preparation techniques.
