

Mark Igra and Nancy Simon's two sons, Alex (9) and Aaron (7), are both alums of EEU. Mark, Nancy and the boys came to the EEU after Alex was diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder at age 2. Alex was a student in the EEU's wonderful Infant Toddler Program, Pre-K and Kindergarten classrooms as well as participating the Baby DATA and DATA autism programs. Aaron spent 4 years in the ITP and Pre-K programs at the EEU. Mark and Nancy are extremely thankful to the EEU for providing support, companionship, hope and community at their most difficult times. The EEU has always provided much more than a great educational opportunity for disabled and typically developing peers but it is also a source of support and advocacy for families. Tonight Mark will talk about how that support was crucial even after Alex left the EEU and struggled with the transition into the broader public school system.

Alex is in the third grade at John Hay elementary school where he is in the autism inclusion program. Alex plays the piano, performs in after school drama club and runs with the Queen Anne Quicksters track team. 

ABOUT THE EEU

WHAT IS THE EEU?

The Experimental Education Unit (EEU) is a school that serves as a national model for integrating students with special needs with typically developing children. The EEU is also a research center, which addresses critical issues in special education as well as a training center providing real world experience for early child-hood professionals.

WHO DOES THE EEU SERVE?

The EEU began in 1960 as a privately funded school for children with neurological injuries. Today, the EEU serves children with developmental disabilities such as Down syndrome, autism, language and motor delays and other special needs. Typically developing children play a vital role as peer models, which distinguish the EEU from other facilities. Programs are provided at no cost to families of all backgrounds.

WHAT PROGRAMS ARE OFFERED AT THE EEU?

- An Infant Toddler Program serving children birth to age 3
- Preschool/Kindergarten programs
- Head Start/Early Childhood Education and Assistance Programs (ECEAP)
- Project DATA (Developmentally Appropriate Treatment for Autism), a school-based program for children with autism
- Summer Camp: EEU's Extended School Year program

HOW PREVALENT IS AUTISM?

The incidence of autism has increased dramatically over the last decade. In the early 1990's medical professionals estimated that 1 in 2,500 children were affected by the disorder. Recent estimates put the prevalence at 1 in 100 children, making autism one of the most common and devastating childhood disorders.







WHAT IS THE EEU'S PERSONAL IMPACT?

Over 4,000 children and their families have been part of the EEU community at one time or another. Hundreds of students, teachers, speech and hearing experts, therapists, nurses, social workers and pediatricians have gained invaluable hands-on experience at the EEU. Many EEU trainees have become distinguished leaders in education and other related fields.

HOW HAVE OTHER ORGANIZATIONS BENEFITED FROM THE EEU?

The EEU is a vital source of information, research and support. Thousands of schools, universities, educators, and communities locally, nationally, and internationally have benefited from the research and programs at the EEU.

HOW IS THE EEU FUNDED?

The EEU operates in association with the University of Washington; however, its primary funding comes from grants, contracts from the Seattle Public Schools, and private donations. Our goal is to build an endowment that will provide dependable and stable support for the school and related services.

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The Norris and Dorothy Haring Center for Applied Research and Training


Created in 2009, the Norris and Dorothy Haring Center for Applied Research and Training in Education grew out of 40 years of groundbreaking work in special education at the Experimental Education Unit. At the Haring Center, families, researchers, and students work closely on their shared mission of providing inclusive educational services for children with and without disabilities. The Haring Center is proud to be a leader in developing, implementing, evaluating, and disseminating strategies to help all students succeed, all teachers to be effective, and all parents to feel confident and competent. Three units are housed at the Haring Center: The Experimental Education Unit (EEU), the Applied Research Unit, and the Professional Development Unit. Directed by Ilene Schwartz, the Haring Center staff is composed of administrative, professional, and support professionals who work together on research, training, and service activities.

A Family Environment Founded by Dr. Norris Haring, the Experimental Education Unit (EEU) is a national and international leader in educating children with developmental disabilities. A model for inclusive education, the EEU is a comprehensive early learning environment for children from infancy through kindergarten. In EEU classrooms, young children diagnosed with autism, Down syndrome, and other disabilities learn alongside their typically developing peers. A team of professionals in each classroom develops individual plans to address students' particular academic, social, communication, and physical needs. Families play an integral role in the educational process. Parents and other family members have access to support services such as counseling and training on how to supplement their children's education in the home. Through the numerous family programs, parents find an open, supportive network of EEU teachers, staff, and parents.

Training the Next Generation of Special Education Leaders The Professional Development Unit provides training to graduate students in the College of Education's special education department (one of the most highly regarded in the U.S.) and to thousands of visitors from across the globe, representing a variety of disciplines such as teaching, social work, psychology, speech/hearing sciences, occupational/physical therapy, and nursing/pediatric medicine. The CARE Clinic, opened this year, provides training to psychologists and students in areas of assessment and intervention for people with disabilities across the lifespan.

Making Research a Priority The Applied Research Unit houses numerous research projects aimed at improving learning among children with special needs. It is here that researchers develop curriculum and assessment materials and conduct research to improve classroom instructional methods. Researchers and educators carefully monitor student progress and individualize educational programs based on performance data from every student. Center researchers use these data and the experiences of many children and teachers to develop and disseminate sustainable instructional materials and teaching procedures, many of which have become recommended practices in special education. For example, the classroom approach that is used to teach children with Down syndrome in the majority of our nation's classrooms is a model curriculum that was initially developed at the Haring Center. For the past 10 years, research on children with autism has led to a model program that has already been replicated in school districts across the U.S. and in 17 other countries. As a result of this work and the dissemination of the Center's best practices and models, countless students are thriving in regular, integrated P-12 classrooms and are receiving the education they deserve.

RULES OF THE AUCTION

Registration When you arrive at the auction and check-in at the registration desk, you will receive a packet with your bid number and bid card. Keep your number with you! By bidding in the Live or Silent auctions, each bidder agrees to these Auction rules.

Silent Auction All items in the Silent Auction have a corresponding bid form. To bid on an item, write your bid number on the bid sheet next to the preprinted amount of your choice. All Silent Auction items will have a "Guaranteed Purchase" bid. By signing your bid number in this box, the bidding on this item closes and the item is now yours. Once you write your bid number on the bid sheet, do not cross your number out. As each Silent Auction area closes, an Auction representative will circle the winning number on the bid sheet.

Live Auction Once the Live Auction begins, it will continue without intermission until all items have been auctioned. To enter a bid, the bidder signals either the auctioneer or one of the spotters using your bid card. Use only the bid number assigned to you. The auctioneer will determine who the successful bidder is. Please hold your bid card so that the number can be easily seen. The auctioneer acknowledges winners of Live Auction bids and the purchaser will sign a bid sheet, which will be brought to the table. This signature will constitute a legal contract to buy. In the event of any disputes between bidders, the auctioneer shall have sole and final discretion to determine the successful bidder or to re-offer the item in dispute. The value set forth for items being auctioned are donors' estimates and are not warranted by the Auction for general value. All sales are final. There will be no exchanges or refunds except where noted.

Payment A signature constitutes a legal contract to buy. All sales are final and there will be no exchanges or refunds unless specified. All items must be paid for by evening's end unless you are using the Express Checkout system. We accept checks, MasterCard, and Visa. For items that are jointly purchased by two or more parties, the signer is the designated payee. Please make your own arrangements for reimbursement by your co-purchasers.

Express Checkout Participants who wish to speed up their checkout at the end of the evening may request Express Checkout when you receive your packet at the beginning of the evening. Participants will be asked to leave a credit card slip.

Time Limit Unless otherwise stated, use of condominiums, houses, dinners, cabins, tickets, certificates, services, etc., is to take place within one year following the auction, at a time mutually agreeable to both the winner and the donor.

Warranties The EEU Auction Committee has attempted to catalog and describe the items and property correctly, but all items and property are sold "as is." EEU neither warrants nor represents, and shall in no event be responsible for the correctness of description, genuineness, authorship, provenance or condition of property. The EEU reserves the right to withdraw any item for sale prior to the call for bids and/or prior to payment completion and reserves the right to adjust the donor's estimate of retail value.

Removal At the end of the Auction, proceed to the Check Out Rooms to pay for (if you did not use Express Checkout) and pick up your merchandise. All items must be removed on the night of the auction. The EEU will not store items for later pickup.

Each bidder agrees to hold EEU, its elected and appointed member and employees, the auctioneer, the organization, sponsors, and/or volunteers connected with the Auction harmless from any liability arising therein.
