# **Definition of Palliative Care**

Specialized medical care for people with serious illnesses... focused on providing relief from the symptoms, pain, and stress of a serious illness - whatever the diagnosis

The goal is to improve quality of life for the patient and family... provided by a team of doctors, nurses, and other specialists who work with a patient's other doctors to provide an extra layer of support

Palliative care is appropriate at any age and at any stage in a serious illness, and can be provided together with curative treatment

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### Palliative, End-of-life, and Hospice Care



- Palliative care: care for patients with serious illness identifying goals of care, treating symptoms, and improving quality of life
- End-of-life care: for those who are actively dying
- <u>Hospice care</u>: important model for delivery of endof-life care

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## New Way of Approaching Serious Illness

#### Old Model

- Feel abandoned
- Stress and distress
- Focus on technology
- Decisions based on what treatments are available

#### New Model

- Feel supported
- Communication
- Focus on quality of life
- Decisions based on patient's values and goals



### **Primary and Specialty Palliative Care**

### Primary palliative care

Care provided by all clinicians caring for patients with serious illness

### Specialty palliative care

Care provided by palliative care specialists including physicians, nurses, social workers, spiritual care providers and others

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# **PCCE Over the Past Year**

- Palliative Care Center of Excellence (PCCE) launched in October 2012
- Mission: Improve palliative care received by patients with serious illness and their families and provide support to clinicians
- Strategy: Develop new knowledge and educational and clinical resources to improve palliative care locally, regionally, and globally

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## Four-fold Strategy for Clinical Palliative Care

- 1. Develop and implement standards for UW Medicine palliative care services
- 2. Develop and implement quality metrics and a quality dashboard

- 3. Develop screening programs to identify patients with unmet palliative care needs
- 4. Achieve Joint Commission Advanced Certification for Palliative Care
