Clara Berridge, MSW, PhD, is a gerontologist who studies the social and ethical implications of technologies that enable remote monitoring. Her research engages issues of privacy, autonomy, and decision-making about technology use and examines the ways diverse stakeholders interact with and assess remote monitoring technologies. Her current research compares the preferences of older adults and their adult children for monitoring technologies in the home and examines the surveillance of workers in nursing home residence rooms. Berridge completed a postdoctoral fellowship at Brown University's Center for Gerontology and Healthcare Research and earned her PhD in Social Welfare from the University of California, Berkeley. She earned her MSW from the University of Washington where she returned in 2016 as an assistant professor.
