While the U.S. economy appears to be coming out of a long recession, the slow recovery and continued budget restraints are affecting many of our state's residents. In response to this situation, the Washington State Office of Financial Management is working on ways that the state can improve our economy and services. In order to make sure that we are addressing the specific needs of our state, we have asked Gilmore Research Group, an independent research company in Washington State, to conduct a survey of our state's population.

The survey can be completed at your convenience, so please let the interviewer know if another time is more suitable for you. Your answers to the questions are **strictly confidential**, and all identifying information will be destroyed as soon as the data collection process is complete.
