F. Additional Information:

- ◆ Course work for the Ph.D. consists of 77 credits, 27 of which are will be taken as dissertation credits subsequent to completion of course work. Of the remaining 50 credits, 25 are to be taken at the 500 level. Students are encouraged to take courses in outside departments but must do so in consultation and with the approval of the Graduate Program Coordinator.
- ◆ Proposals for independent study to fulfill graduate level requirements must be submitted in writing on an Independent Study Proposal form to the Graduate Program Coordinator, who will determine whether the project is acceptable to fulfill one of the program requirements based upon your prior academic performance and the merits of the proposal.
- ◆ Overall GPA of 3.6 must be maintained. Minimum acceptable grade for any course is 2.7.
