Dr. Watson received his B.S from American University in Washington, D.C. and his M.S. in Medical Genetics and Ph.D. in Physiology and Biophysics from the University of Alabama at Birmingham. He is Executive Director of the American College of Medical Genetics and an Adjunct Professor of Pediatrics at Washington University in St. Louis where he was Director of Clinical and Molecular Cytogenetics from 1986 – 2000. He is certified by the American Board of Medical Genetics in Clinical Cytogenetics and PhD Medical Genetics.

Dr. Watson has a long standing interest in the translation of genetic information into health care use. He was a founder of the American College of Medical Genetics for which he has served as Vice President for Laboratory Affairs and has chaired its Test and Technology Transfer Committee, Economics Committee, Laboratory Practices Committee and Intellectual Property Committee. He co-chaired the NIH-ELSI/HHS Task Force on Genetics Testing from 1995 – 1997. Most recently, he was the project director for a MCHB/HRSA funded project to bring uniformity to newborn screening in the United States. He is currently the Director of the National Coordinating Center for Regional Genetics and Newborn Screening Collaboratives..

Dr. Watson has been the author of over 75 peer reviewed publications and book chapters.
