Saturday, November 7 7:30am – 8:30 am	Motivational Interviewing With an Older Mexican American Woman <i>University of Texas at Austin with funding through the CSWE Gero-Ed Center's Master's Advanced Curriculum Project</i>	In this 3-part video, you will hear experts discuss principles and skills of Motivational Interviewing, see a demonstration with an older Mexican American woman engaged in risk drinking, and view a debriefing of the intervention. Funded through the CSWE Gero-Ed Center's Master's Advanced Curriculum Project. <i>56 minutes</i>
Saturday, November 7 1:30pm – 3:00 pm	Louie, Louie: A Portrait in Parkinson's <i>Media Projects, Inc.</i>	This is Cynthia Salzman Mondell's documentary about her father's 30-year battle with the disease. It chronicles one family's personal story of their struggle to cope with tremendous emotional and physical responsibilities of caregiving. <i>37 minutes</i>
	Body & Soul: Diana & Kathy <i>Welcome Change Productions</i>	This film is a rare look at crises in a unique relationship between two people with disabilities. The story moves beyond disability and activism to acceptance of a profound friendship. Shot in an intimate style, it allows the viewer into a private world. <i>40 minutes</i>
	Backseat Bingo <i>Terra Nova Films</i>	This clever animated film effectively dispels societal preconceptions about romance and older adults. As a refreshingly candid group of 70- to 90-something seniors share personal revelations on their continued need for intimacy, this video serves as a powerful reminder that intimacy remains an integral part of healthy aging. <i>6 minutes</i>
Sunday, November 8 7:30am – 8:30am	Big Mama <i>California Newsreel</i>	This documentary follows the life of Viola Dees, a grandmother aged ninety, and Walter, her nine year old grandson in South Central, L.A.. Dee has raised Walter on her own since he was four when his father, Viola's son, died. <i>40 minutes</i>
	Demonstration of Substance Use Intervention with Older Adults <i>University of Chicago with funding through the CSWE Gero-Ed Center's Master's Advanced Curriculum Project</i>	This video demonstrates motivational interviewing strategies, age-appropriate screening tools, and treatment methods for substance use. This segment demonstrates brief intervention and relapse prevention therapy with an older male client by a social worker in a primary care medical setting. Funded through the CSWE Gero-Ed Center's Master's Advanced Curriculum Project. <i>16 minutes</i>
Sunday, November 8 1:30 pm – 3:00 pm	The Way We Get By <i>Dungby Productions</i>	On call 24/7 for the past six years, three senior citizens have made history by greeting nearly one million U.S. troops at a tiny airport in Maine. Filled with unexpected turns, their uplifting and emotional journey demonstrates the meaning of community at a time when America needs it most. <i>84 minutes</i>

Sunday, November 8 3:30pm – 5:00 pm	Embracing Aging: Families Facing Change <i>Third Way Media</i>	This film features families, experts, and older adults sharing their struggles and practical insights on aging, housing choices, facing illness and more. Residents of a cohousing community offer attractive alternatives for the aging years. 58 minutes
Monday, November 9 7:30am – 8:30am	One Wedding and a Revolution <i>Ground Spark</i>	The mayor of San Francisco decided to stop discriminating against lesbian and gay couples by instructing city and county officials to allow them to get married. Del Martin and Phyllis Lyon, founders of the first lesbian-rights organization in the 1950s, were invited to be the first to tie the knot. 19 minutes
	Curtain Call <i>Terra Nova Films</i>	This video unfolds the real-life story of the clash of emotions between a mother who had a stroke and her daughters as they struggle to find a balance between the daughter's concern for her safety and the mother's desire to make her own choices and live her own life. 12 minutes
	Positive Images of Aging <i>Terra Nova Films</i>	This is a compilation DVD that gives you access to 14 different video segments, 3-5 minutes in length, that each reflect a positive image of aging. The segments that will be shown are: Changing Perceptions of Aging and Positive Adjustment as We Age. 12 minutes
Monday, November 9 10:30am – 12:00pm	Aphasia: Struggling for Understanding <i>Filmakers Library</i>	What if your ability to speak or understand speech was taken away and you struggled to find words that just won't come? People with aphasia are damaged by stroke or brain injury. Language pathologists have found new ways to teach aphasics express themselves with new words and ways to communicate. 14 minutes
	Ten More Good Years <i>LookOut Films, Inc.</i>	This award-winning documentary poignantly depicts the lives of four LGBT elders from California to New York struggling with issues such as outdated tax laws; unfair Medicaid, Medicare, and Social Security regulations; a lack of cultural competence in social services; and the need for nondiscriminatory housing. 71 minutes
Monday, November 9 1:30pm – 3:00pm	Rewarding Challenges: Social Work With Older Adults <i>Council on Social Work Education Press</i>	This DVD was published to help meet growing needs for gerontological social work resources. General practitioners and those in other specialties must have a strong foundation in older adult issues to be most effective. Viewers have the opportunity to rethink assumptions about older adults including issues of transference and counter-transference. 42 minutes
	Interview & Assessment of Ethnic Elders: Mexican American Elders <i>Arizona State University with funding through the CSWE Gero-Ed Center's Master's Advanced Curriculum Project</i>	This video prepares MSW students to conduct culturally-responsive interviews and assessments with Mexican-American elders. Objectives include preparatory work, establishing rapport, eliciting information to explore cultural beliefs, ethnographic inquiry, transference and counter-transference, immigration-related issues, common challenges, and tools for practice and assessment. Funded through the CSWE Gero-Ed Center's Master's Advanced Curriculum Project. 28 minutes
