- RE: 5-year Review of the Master of Education in Educational Leadership offered by the School of Educational Studies (2014-2015)

This memo outlines the recommendations from the 5-year review of the Master of Education (MEd) in Educational Leadership offered by the School of Educational Studies at the University of Washington Bothell. This includes the Leadership Development for Educators (LEDE) program and the Expanding Capacity for Special Education Leadership (ECSEL) program. The LEDE program launched in 2010 and the ECSEL program in 2012. This was the first Graduate School review of the MEd in Educational Leadership.

Process

The School of Educational Studies submitted a detailed report describing the Master of Education LEDE and ECSEL programs. The report included information on faculty and students; program curriculum; progress and programmatic changes since inception; challenges; and goals for the future.

A subcommittee of the Graduate School Council presented recommendations based on the written documentation to the full Council at its meeting on April 2, 2015.

Graduate School Council Recommendations

After discussion, the Council recommended the Master of Education in Educational Leadership be granted continuing status. Subsequent academic program review will be integrated into the School of Educational Studies' next academic program review (2019-2020).

We concur with the Council's recommendations.
