# Program Review of The Department of Chemistry Fall 2011: Catalyst Survey Results

The Graduate and Professional Student Senate (GPSS) conducts program reviews of academic departments that coincide with the Graduate School's Program Review process. GPSS reviews are a vital component of the final Graduate School Program Report, because the data collected and presented by the GPSS serves as the primary source of graduate and/or professional student feedback in the Graduate School's Program Review process.

For most reviews, the GPSS conducts a two-part review of the academic department that results in two separate reports. The first part is based on an electronically administered Catalyst Survey requesting feedback from the graduate and/or professional students within the department being reviewed. The survey results are largely quantitative and the results of that survey contained within this report. The second part of the GPSS sponsored program review involves two GPSS Senators conducting an in-house focus group session dedicated to further exploring issued raised by the Catalyst Survey and collecting largely qualitative information. The Senators take their notes from the focus group and compile the second report. The results of the focus group meeting should be reported within one to two weeks after the external review committee has visited the department.

## **Chemistry Graduate Program Review**

### **Review Scope and Purpose**

This review **DOES** contain a summary of graduate student opinions and feelings regarding their department.

This review **DOES NOT** seek to evaluate the department or give a general overview of the academic program. For more general and background data regarding the department, academic program, faculty, courses, and research, please see the *Chemistry Department Self-Study*.

### **Executive Summary of Findings**

The Graduate and Professional Student Senate (GPSS) sponsored and administered a Catalyst Survey to the graduate and/or professional students in the Chemistry Department between 7<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> of October 2011. The two GPSS Chemistry Department Senators, Ms. Alina Schimpf and Mr. Sanjay Hari, assisted the GPSS achieve a 25% return rate (47/180) for this survey. The purpose of this survey was to ensure the voice and opinion of the students within this program was included in the review process and thereby taken into account during the planning of the future direction of the program. The results of this survey are summarized within this executive summary, while a copy of the survey and the summarized data are presented as appendices. The original survey data is available from the GPSS upon request, and a summary of the data is provided in this report (Appendix A).

**Executive Summary of Survey Results:** The follow sections correspond to the sections as indicated in the survey (Appendix B).

#### I. Academic Program

- The majority of respondents agreed (~75%) the department's academic standards, integration of current developments in the field, and the space and facilities are of high quality.
- The majority of respondents (~75%) believed the intellectual quality of the faculty and graduate students were of high quality, and that the department does a very good job of fostering a sense a community among them.
- The majority of respondents agreed that the program supports their research goals and encourages collaboration and teamwork, but there is some indication that most of this collaboration appears to be taking place within the department and not necessarily involving cross-disciplinary collaboration.



#### **II. Research Experience**

- The majority (~75%) of respondents feel they were being well-trained prior to beginning their research, but only half feel as if they receive above average or higher quality faculty guidance and assistance from technical staff in their research.
- Less than half of the respondents indicate they have received experience-writing grants, attended a professional conference and/or presented scholarly research.



#### **III.** Career Counseling and Job Search

• 20-40% of the survey respondents did not participate in a series of questions asking about assistance with career counseling and job searches. However, of those that did, approximately 50% felt the department was doing a satisfactory job.

#### IV. Advising

- The majority of respondents (50-75%) feel they are receiving good advice from their advisors regarding preparation for oral and written examinations, thesis and dissertation proposals, research, plagiarism and intellectual property issues.
- A few respondents noted the primary focus of the department is on training students for academic careers, and 30% felt the department was doing a poor job of providing guidance on careers outside of academia and/or searching for outside positions.

#### V. Departmental Community

• The majority of respondents (50-75%+) feel as if the program is committed to attracting, accepting and helping to support diverse students, but (84%) of the student does not know if the department has a diversity committee.

#### VI. Funding

• 75% of the respondents indicated they would accumulate no student loan debt as a result of attending this program, while 20% will accrue upwards of \$25,000 in debt.



- The majority of respondents indicated (80%+) that they have some sort of funding either via a TA/RA position or grant and do not take loans or expend personal funds.
- The majority of respondents (70-80%) indicated the criteria for funding was clear and the program provided adequate funding for its students.

#### **VII. General Assessment**

- The majority of students (~75%) rate the overall quality of their academic experience as being very good to excellent.
- The majority of students (50-80%) identify the following as being somewhat of an obstacle to their academic progress:
  - o (limitations of) research facilities/space/technology
  - work/financial commitments
  - o family obligations
  - o availability of faculty
  - o program structure and/or requirements
  - o dissertation topic/research
  - o course scheduling
  - o immigration laws or regulations
- Approximately 67% of the respondents are confident they will complete their degree objectives and they would recommend this program to prospective students.
- The majority of students (~55%) estimate it will take them 5 to 6 years to complete their degree
