- Other Emergency Information Tools
 - o In Case of Emergency (ICE) ICE is a program that enables first responders, such as EMTs and police, to identify victims and an emergency contact for important medical information. Individuals are encouraged to enter emergency contacts in their phone or address book under the name "ICE". Alternately, a person can list multiple emergency contacts as "ICE1", "ICE2", etc.

Medical Identification Tag - A **medical identification tag** is a small emblem or tag worn on a bracelet, neck chain, or on the clothing bearing a message that the wearer has an important medical condition that might require immediate attention. The intention is to alert a physician, emergency department personnel or police of the condition even if the wearer is not conscious enough or old enough to explain. Some people prefer to carry a wallet card with the same information.

A new type of medic identification alert is the USB medical alert tag – a USB flash drive that contains an individual's emergency information. Because of the memory on the flash drive these USB medical alert tags are capable of carrying much more information than the conventional medical ID bracelet. Emergency personnel can instantly access the information with any available computer.
