

Paying for Diabetes Supplies

Costco

Costco members can get supplies at lower prices through Costco's Preferred Drug List as long as you are not covered otherwise through private or state insurance. Bayer test strips and Novolog are inexpensive through this program, but not all brands are available. The website will direct you to Costco pharmacies in your region, where you can register by filling out a form.

This handout lists programs that can help to cover the cost of your diabetes supplies.

This is not insurance, but a medical service buying program. You can custom select only the type of provider or supplies you need like dental, vision, chiropractic, or pharmacy at discounted rates. It has individual and household memberships. This is an option for people who cannot afford insurance or who need to supplement insurance with weak benefits. Other offerings include laboratory procedures, mental health, physical therapy, and imaging.

Members can use most national chain pharmacies such as Walgreens, Target, Wal-Mart etc., and independent pharmacies. Big savings on name brand and generic prescription drugs.

The Ameriplan Diabetic package can be useful for people with high co-pays. Provides discounts on supplies that do not need a prescription (so not insulin).

Seattle Children's Hospital Uncompensated Care Program (age 0 to 21)

Children's Hospital has a program that can help families with bills from our medical groups – including prescriptions written by Children's physicians. To apply for Children's Financial Assistance Program, you first fill out a brief eligibility form. The Financial Assistance Program will review this and call you to discuss payment plans, insurance alternatives, and possibly the need to have prescriptions filled here at Children's through Uncompensated Care. Call 206-987-3333 to speak with a financial counselor.

Harborview Medical Center and University of Washington Medical Center

Both Harborview and the UW Medical Center offer a financial assistance program. Please contact 206-598-1950 or 1-877-780-1121 to request more information regarding the assistance that can be offered. Please speak to your provider about a referral to the Endocrine Clinics at these facilities.
