Under the direct supervision of professional staff, the CA establishes a cohesive and responsible community; models and supports issues related to diversity; facilitates the social and professional connections of residents; enforces and abides by the policies of the UW Department of Housing & Food Services (HFS) and the UW as well as Washington State and federal laws in the UW apartment communities; demonstrates sound judgment; participates in and facilitates a team approach with coworkers; completes necessary administrative tasks; and provides appropriate customer service to students and visitors.
