Dr. Beth Ebel on Pediatric Window Falls



HIPRC Core Member Beth Ebel, MD, MSc, MPH (Associate Professor of Pediatrics, Adjunct Associate Professor of Epidemiology and Health Services) spoke at the May 21st Press Conference on Children Falling Out of Windows. King 5 and Kiro 7 News have both quoted Dr. Ebel on the hazards of screens without locks or guards in their articles about pediatric window falls during warm weather. The topic has also spurred articles in the Seattle Times.

"This is not a supervision problem," said Dr. Beth Ebel of Harborview's Injury Prevention and Research Center. "I see parents standing right there, the kid is in front of them, in a fraction of a second the fall occurs."

"Screens are not protective. Many, the majority of window falls we see are kids falling through the screen," Dr. Ebel said. "That screen is not designed to bear the weight of a child and so the screen and the kid fall out."



HIPRC Mentees & Coauthorship Figure



Many of you have seen the amazing poster produced by former HIPRC T-32 Injury Fellow Janessa Graves, PhD, MPH (Assistant Professor of Nursing at Washington State University) by the front desk and have asked about how it was created and how to interpret it.

Here is some more information from Dr. Graves:

- The figure represents co-authorship networks for publications (N=251) identified in PubMed (April 2015) for which authors include both Fred Rivara and a mentee. The mentee list was derived from the 122 names provided by Maria a couple of weeks ago and may not be complete. This figure only includes publications indexed in PubMed. Alternate forms of mentee names were not searched, only full names provided by Maria were used for mentees (e.g., I did not include "Murray, Chris" for Christopher Murray). For Fred, I used various name combos to identify his publications (Rivara, FP; Rivara, Frederick; Rivara, Fred; Rivara, Fred P.; Rivara, Frederick P.). (It was too time consuming to do this for all mentees, and I do not know them all so do not know all possible variations of their names, including maiden names if applicable.)
- In the figure, each node (circle) is a person that is a coauthor on a paper that lists both Fred and a mentee as a coauthor as well. There are 587 circles/names in the figure – 122 are former mentees of Fred (20.8%).
- In terms of the lower right-hand part of the figure, these represent a group of publications that include Fred (and a mentee) that are a singular group that do not really share ties with the other publications in terms of collaboration. (You can think of this figure a bit like a social network.) Specifically, these are the publications that arose from the Global Burden of Diseases, Injuries, and Risk Factors Study 2010 (with Chris Murray and IHME colleagues). I am sure Fred could identify other clusters as well. For example, in the lower left corner, the light blue cluster of authors represents 2 studies in 2007 (Bahman Roudsari first author).
- Fred is obviously the center of the figure because he is the center of this social network. Individuals with many different colored lines emanating from them illustrate authors with many connections in the network.
- This figure isn't perfect. Some folks may be omitted because of spelling errors or variations in names (see note above about this). An individual may also be listed twice if my search of PubMed picked them up as, for example, "O'Connor S." but on another paper he is listed as "O'Connor S.S." (and that latter article also included another mentee, which is why it was still picked up by the search). This is the case for a dozen or so people. (Fred is actually listed twice as Rivara FP and Rivara F, I'm not sure why/how – please see last point below.)
- I apologize for any mistakes and errors this was done quickly and for fun, and I had never done anything like this before (used 2 new software programs in the process). I am sure, with more time, I could have created a figure without errors and potentially more meaningful. I wish had been able to color code mentees, or bold them, but didn't have the time. I honestly did this in a couple of hours.

Fatal Overdoses Linked to Heroin Spike by 58% in King County – Dr. Banta-Green



According to a report released by the University of Washington Alcohol & Drug Abuse Institute (ADAI), fatal overdoses linked to heroin surged by 58 percent in King County last year, fueling the steepest rise in local drug-caused deaths in 17 years. HIPRC Associate Member and ADAI Senior Scientist Caleb Banta-Green, PhD, MSW, MPH (Affiliate Assistant Professor of Health Services) is quoted in an article by the Seattle Times, who calls the trend distressing. "I knew it was going to go up," he said. "I didn't know it was going to go up that much." The report results have also been picked up by MyNorthwest and the Seattle Sun Times.

WPIPN Seminar: Pediatric TBI - A Look at Research and Best Practices

On average between 2007 and 2010, 4,754 children and youth between the ages of 0 and 19 died from a TBI each year. During the same time period, 3.24 million children and adolescents visited the emergency department for treatment of a non-fatal TBI. That's an average of 810,000 ED-treated non-fatal TBIs among 0 through 19 year olds every year—a rate of 974 TBIs per 100,000 population.

To better understand this issue, Dr. Becky Spicer of the Children's Safety Network (CSN) Economic and Data Resource Center at the Pacific Institute for Research and Evaluation (PIRE) will present data about the leading causes of ED-treated non-fatal TBIs. She will break this information out by age group, intent, and mechanism.

Following that presentation, Bekah Hunt, CSN's training and technical assistance associate, will review traumatic brain injury prevention practices. She'll highlight best practices by what caused the TBI, and child's age/developmental stage. She will also share outcomes and lessons learned from the Community of Practice (CoP) on Traumatic Brain Injury, a CSN led initiative in which 15 states participated between 2013 and 2014.

Finally, Peg Ogea-Ginsburg, leader of the Nebraska CoP team, and director of Nebraska's Injury and Violence Prevention Program will talk about their experience with the CoP, and their work on sports related concussions.
