comfortable gathering place.

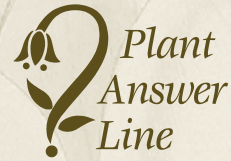

In 1983 Seattle attorney Pendleton Miller made a gift to the University of Washington to establish a horticultural library that would serve the public. The gift honored his wife, Elisabeth Carey Miller, who played a leading role in the creation of the Center for Urban Horticulture. Mrs. Miller received international recognition for her years of work on behalf of Northwest horticulture and her own extraordinary garden.



Today, over 15,000 people visit the Miller Library each year; thousands more call or email with reference questions. Staff and volunteers help patrons find the right book, magazine article or website to answer common and not-so-common gardening questions. Public computers are available for independent research and DVDs and videos may be viewed in the media carrel.
