Conservation in the City: The UW-BG Collection at the Arboretum



Introduction The UW-BG's goal is to assess their collection of plants of global conservation concern every 5 years, however, the last assessment was performed in 2001. By now, we expect that the collection has grown in scope, due to continued habitat loss of species worldwide.

Why? The UW-BG collection at the Arboretum is of critical importance, as ex-situ cultivation of wild-provenance stock is rapidly becoming a key strategy of global conservation efforts. In this way, genetic diversity is preserved and these grand species may continue to exist.

Methods

- 1. Check current UW-BG plant list against the most recent Redlist published by the International Union for the Conservation of Nature (IUCN)
- **2.** Update the UW BG-Base with current IUCN conservation criteria
- **3.** Perform field checks of individual specimens to assess overall health and vigor
- **4.** Review the provenance of the specimens in the Collection, so conservation value may be ranked

To Date Nearly 10% of the entire Collection is of conservation importance, with nearly a four-fold increase in at-risk species since 2001











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
