Constructing the Past in the Middle East

Summer Institute to be held in Istanbul, Turkey and Thessaloniki, Greece in July 2006. Funded by the <u>Getty Foundation</u>, in partnership with the University of Washington's <u>Department of History</u>, cooperation of <u>Istanbul Bilgi University</u>.

Monuments, religion, understanding the past, nation states, global vs. local: today, these topics are more than just academic.

This intensive month-long program offers an in-depth examination of how objects, buildings, and institutions conserve, preserve, and recreate the past for diverse communities—now and for the future. Participants and invited lecturers discuss recent critical approaches to national patrimony, cultural memory, reception history, and the power of images, buildings, and museums to mold communities. The program features a one-week field trip to Thessaloniki, Greece and three weeks in Istanbul, Turkey with a field trip to the Gallipoli Peninsula.

Topics include:

- Representing and Appropriating the Past: Theory and Interpretation [Monuments and Layering]
- Seeing the Past in Selected Sites in Turkey and Greece [Layering, Memorializing, and Displaying]
- Constructing the Pasts of the Middle East and Greece [Monuments and Memorializing]
- Museums and the Photographic Record [Displaying and Photographing]

Criteria for Participation:

Eligibility

- Applications are invited from scholars with a PhD or equivalent professional experience in art history, antiquities organizations, museums, conservation and monument commissions, cultural anthropology geography, history, comparative literature, and urban planning
- The Summer Institute seeks participants from diverse backgrounds and national identities.
- Full program residency and participation in day and evening seminar activities are required as detaile
- Fluency in spoken and written English is required since all program activities will be conducted in Eng

Fellowship Benefits

All successful applicants will be awarded a fellowship, which features:

- 1. Round trip airfare
- 2. Lodging and meals for the duration of the Institute
- 3. Site admissions
- 4. Institute materials

Fellowship Requirements:

- Attendance and participation in all Institute activities
- Attendance at common meals breakfast through dinner Monday through Friday noon
- Participation in and presentation of assigned readings and group activities
