

SEATTLE, the city of wonders and of workers! Almost overnight there has appeared upon the shores of Puget Sound an industrial center to which the eyes of the nation are turned. Seattle's workers have captured the imagination of the world with the marvelous speed with which they build ships. On the waterfront the longshoremen have handled the ever growing volume of ocean freight until Seattle has reached the proud position of Second Port in the United States. From Ballard to Georgetown and from West Seattle to Ravenna Park the city hums with action of shipbuilding and manufacturing.

As the chief evidence of growth Seattle may well point to the fact that Organized Labor's ranks have increased within the past three years from about 20,000 members to over 65,000. For the barometer of industry is invariably the number of workers employed and the fact that they are organized at once projects the picture of good, American industrial standards, with the attendant good wages and working conditions, good homes, good living, good citizenship. About 27,000 of these organized workers are in the shipyards, smashing world's records in shipbuilding. Still other thousands are building houses, on the longshore, in the steel mills, creating wealth in the factories, on the trucks, in the stores and doing their part in the hundred and one lines of business and commerce that go to make up a big city.

While the eyes of the nation are turned toward Seattle as the coming metropolis of the West, because of her tremendous commercial expansion, the eyes of the working, producing world are cast upon the Puget Sound city as a high light of the labor movement. In no other city of the world has the organized working class been recognized as in Seattle. Employers and business men who advocate the "open shop" are few and far between. To most of them has come the realization that efficient and effective labor must be organized labor; that higher wages and better working conditions mean better business and a better city and citizenry. No city is more prosperous than its poorest paid worker. Poor pay is poor policy. Good wages are spent for good goods. Seattle wants no slums nor slum-bustings. The pinch-penny-policy cannot find a place to stop and rest in Seattle. Everybody is too busy to tease the eagle on a dollar. The big, open-handed idea's the thing. It's Seattle spirit in its 'n' power. Seattle's an organized city, organized for business, betterment and the good of its citizens.

With a population of a little over 200,000 in 1910, 300,000 in 1916, and 450,000 in 1918, the rate of growth predicts that in 1925 over three-quarters of a million people will call Seattle their home town. After they are here awhile most of them will be progressive in their concepts as citizens. For no one can live long in Seattle and not become imbued with the social idea. The boys who have gone from Seattle to fight the battle for democracy are coming home to Seattle to find that the democracy they offered to lay down their lives for has been fostered in their home town. Seattle has no "Four Hundred." Her aristocracy consists of noblemen in the kingdom of Denmark. The overall is the royal purple and the worker is the knight of production.
