## **1 Goals of Linguistics Department TA<sup>1</sup> training activities**

The purpose of TA training within the Linguistics Department is to:

- establish a departmental community of teachers who can be a resource for each other
- provide a forum where lessons learned by grad student teachers can be shared with each other

At the beginning of every Autumn quarter, the Linguistics Department holds a workshop for new and continuing TAs. Some TAs may find some parts of the departmental workshop not immediately applicable to their upcoming teaching assignments. However, sometimes last minute staffing changes occur, so a seemingly irrelevant topic may turn out to be useful some time.

## **2 New TAs**

### ***2.1 Center for Teaching and Learning TA Training***

New TAs (or any who have never attended the CTL training) should attend at least part of the 2013 TA Conference on Teaching, Learning and Research (Conference Core Workshops) on Tuesday Sept 17 and Wednesday Sept 18. We also recommend that new TAs attend one or more of the Wednesday Sept 18 technology sessions which are also part of the CTL conference.

New TAs should come to this event having prepared a 3-to-4-minute teaching segment on any topic of their choosing.
