

Director of Transfusion Medicine: Columbia University

The Department of Pathology and Cell Biology at Columbia University is recruiting a Director of the Transfusion Medicine and Cell Therapy Section on the Columbia University Campus of the New York Presbyterian Hospital. We seek an energetic and experienced MD or MD/PhD, who is BC in clinical pathology, internal medicine, or pediatrics and BE/BC in Transfusion Medicine to lead this section, which encompasses the Blood Bank, Therapeutic Apheresis Unit, and Cell Processing Laboratory. This section currently has four faculty members and 1-2 transfusion medicine fellows, and supports very active programs in solid organ (i.e. heart, kidney, liver, lung, small bowel, islet, etc.) and hematopoietic stem cell transplantation. The presence of multiple clinical and research centers, including an NCI-funded Cancer Center, the Columbia Genome Center, and the Children's Hospital of New York, provide additional opportunities for clinical service and research collaborations. The successful candidate will participate in medical student teaching, resident and fellow training, and patient-oriented, translational, and/or basic research.
