

Seating Marshal #16

- I. **Check-in (12:00 p.m.):** Go through the faculty security check-in at the Dempsey Indoor Practice Facility northeast of the stadium. From there you may proceed to the stadium floor. All seating marshals should be in position in the stadium by 1:20 p.m. The procession begins promptly at 1:30 p.m.

- II. **Procession (see diagram, p. 2):** Start at position #16. You will be seating candidates in the *even-labeled* rows, 21 per row, beginning in doctoral section #1 and moving back. Doctoral Marshal #16, arriving with the doctoral candidates, will assist you.

The doctoral marshal “feeds” the students into a row. You should be positioned about 10 ft. from the current row being “fed.” Hold the students back and, once a row has been filled, count out 21 students for the next row. Doctoral candidates will arrive first, followed by master’s candidates. If you run out of seats, direct students laterally to available seats in their degree section. When the bachelor candidates arrive, permit the College Marshals leading them to pass by and proceed to the stage. Be sure that the final row of bachelor candidates has equal numbers on the north and south sides.

After the candidates have been seated, the Deans’ Party, then the President’s Party, will process to the stage. As the President’s Party proceeds down the center aisle, walk back up the (quarter) aisle you have been working, toward the stage. When the entire President’s Party has reached the stage, proceed up the north ramp to your seat.

- III. **Doctoral march to the stage (see diagram, page 3):** After the commencement address, University Marshal Moore will announce the presentation of the various degrees. Move to “m” shown on the *doctoral march* diagram at this time. Direct candidates to exit their rows as shown on the doctoral march diagram. As each row exits, move back to direct the next row. Once all candidates have exited, you may help reseating candidates as they return from the stage. At the completion of the doctoral degrees, move to new position “m,” shown on the *master’s march* diagram.

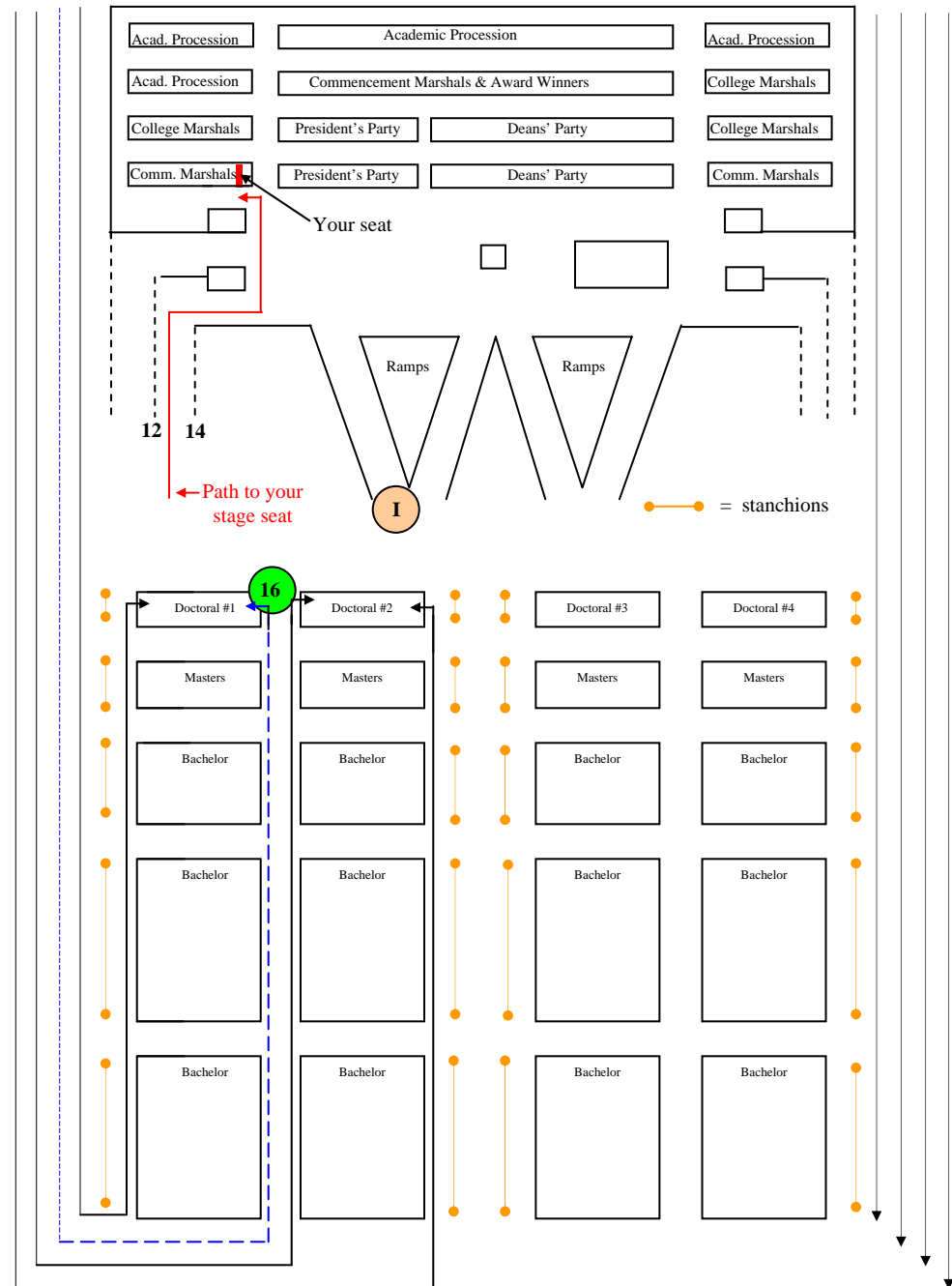
- IV. **Master’s march (see diagram, page 3):** From master’s position “m” direct candidates in master’s section #1 to exit their rows as shown on the master’s march diagram. As each row exits move back to direct the next row’s exit. Other marshals will direct candidates back to you for reseating. Students wearing the purple and gold buttons signal the start of a new row. A master’s marshal will assist you. At the completion of the master’s degrees, move to position “m,” as shown on the *bachelor march* diagram.

- V. **Bachelor march (see diagram, page 4):** At position “m” direct candidates to exit their rows as shown on the bachelor march diagram. As each row exits, move back to direct the next row. Other marshals will reseat the candidates as they return from the stage. When the last row of candidates has exited, move to position “I” (see page 2).

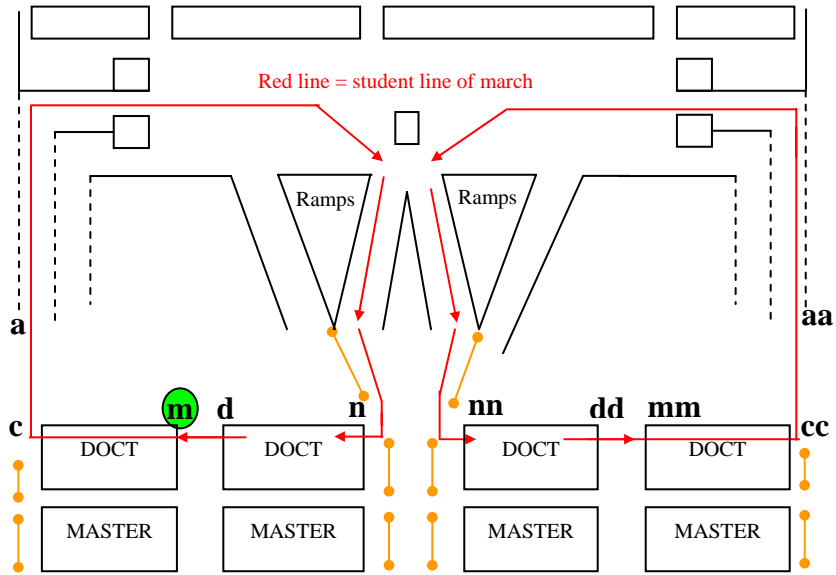
- VI. **Recessional (see diagram, page 2):** At position “I,” direct faculty exiting the stage to the center aisle. Be alert for slips or stumbles. As the last members of the faculty leave the stage, join them and proceed to the west end of the stadium. From there you may disperse with the rest of the faculty or exit via the tunnel to the faculty dressing room.

Processional and Recessional Positions

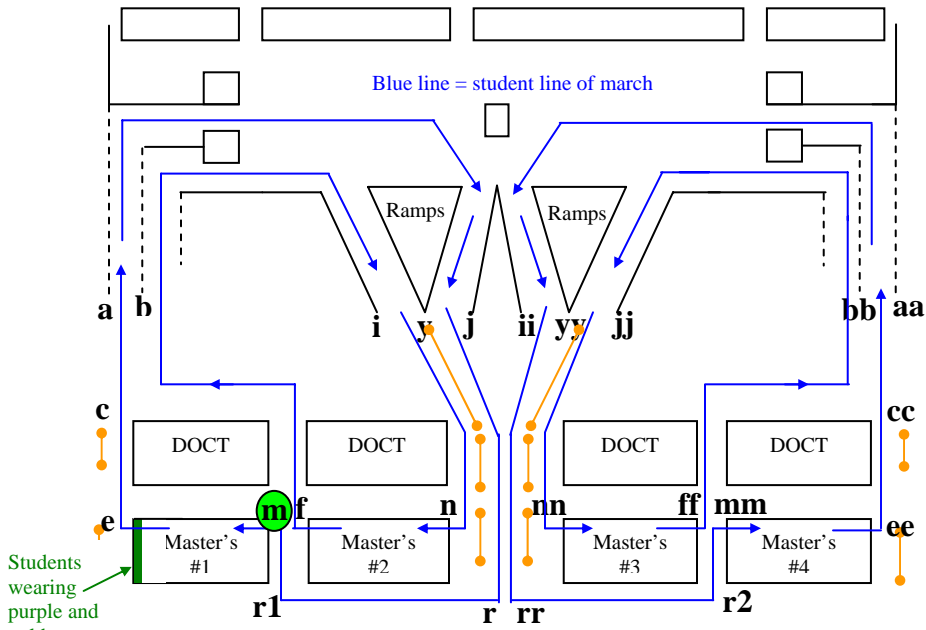
Blue line = student line of march
