Provides support for study/research/teaching in a single country

• You can meet, work, live with and learn from the people of the host country, sharing daily experiences.

Facilitates cultural exchange

 Through direct interaction on an individual basis in the classroom, field, home, and in daily tasks, you can gain an appreciation of others' viewpoints and beliefs, the way they do things, and the way they think.

Promotes mutual understanding

 Through engagement in the community, you can interact with your hosts on a one-toone basis in an atmosphere of openness, academic integrity, and intellectual freedom.
